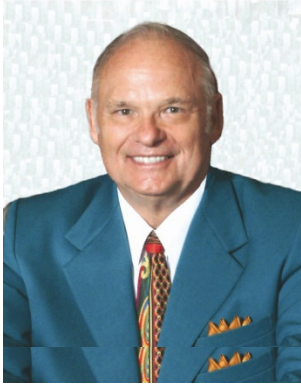

Statement of Faith

- (1) WE BELIEVE the Scriptures to be the inspired and inerrant Word of God.
- (2) WE BELIEVE in one God, composed of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
- (3) WE BELIEVE that Jesus Christ is true God and true man, having been conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin, Mary.
- (4) WE BELIEVE that Jesus Christ died on the cross and shed His blood as a sacrifice for our sins, that He physically arose from the dead, ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the God the Father.

- (5) WE BELIEVE in the ministry of the Holy Spirit to glorify Christ, to convict men of sin, and to empower believers.
- (6) WE BELIEVE that man was created in the image of God, but fell into sin.
- (7) WE BELIEVE that man can be justified only by grace through personal faith in Jesus Christ.

- (9) WE BELIEVE that the true Church is made up of people, who through faith in Jesus Christ, have been regenerated by the Holy Spirit.
- (10) WE BELIEVE in the literal second coming of Jesus Christ to judge the living and the dead.
- (11) WE BELIEVE in the bodily resurrection of all the dead.
- (12) WE BELIEVE in eternal blessedness for the believer, and eternal punishment for the unbeliever.
- (13) WE BELIEVE that Christ wants His Church to carry the Gospel into all the world.
- (14) WE BELIEVE that the Holy Spirit is at work today through His gifts, fruit, and anointed ministers.
- (15) WE BELIEVE that the gifts of the Holy Spirit are given to every believer and need to be activated and exercised to fulfill their divine purpose of blessing the body of Christ.
- (16) WE BELIEVE in the baptism of the Holy Spirit; that the Spirit gives each believer their own private prayer/praise language used to edify themselves, and that such a baptism empowers believers to be effective for Christ.
- (17) WE BELIEVE in physical healing of the body as part of the atoning work of Jesus Christ. This healing can be received and also ministered to others by various divine giftings.
- (18) WE BELIEVE in the full function of the five-fold ministry that was given to perfect and equip the saints.
- (19) WE BELIEVE in present-day ministries of the apostles and prophets as foundational and revelational ministries. We believe these two ministries will be fully restored in power and authority before the second coming of Christ.
- (20) WE BELIEVE that the Church of Jesus Christ is God's instrument to establish and extend God's Kingdom until the second coming of Christ.

CERTIFICATE AND BACHELOR DEGREE PROGRAMS

CI Asia Seminary is working with Family of Faith College in Shawnee, Oklahoma, in order to enable students to transfer credits onto a Bachelor Degree program. Students wishing to enter the Bachelor Degree program must first enroll on the Certificate in Church Ministry program for one year. At the completion of one year, students may then transfer their credits onto the Bachelor program.

The CI Asia Seminary, in conjunction with the Christian International School of Theology (Santa Rosa Beach, Florida) will offer the following degrees to qualified applicants:

Payment Plan for Distance Learning

Distance learning students can pay 50% of the tuition for the course selected prior to starting the course. The remainder is due within 60 days of commencement. All other fees must be paid in full, including book and mailing fees, prior to commencing the course. Any payment that is not received within 60 days will be considered late, and a \$30 late charge will be added. Any time a payment becomes at least 30 days past due, the CI Asia Seminary has the right to demand the balance be paid immediately. Failure to comply will result in necessary action by the Academic Board. All fees must be paid at the conclusion of the student's education. Certificates will only be sent once all fees have been received. Students who wish to pay for their entire course tuition in advance at the time of registration will receive a 5% discount.

Refund Policy

The student has the right to withdraw from a course, provided the student notifies the School Dean of CI Asia Seminary by EMAIL and REGULAR MAIL. The amount of refund is calculated from the date the course was shipped to the student, to the postmarked date of the cancellation request.

Unused/Unmarked Course Materials

The return of all unused course and textbook materials in new condition allows the student the following options:

1. If returned with a postmark within 72-hours, the student is given a full, 100%, refund of tuition and textbook costs.
2. If returned within 30 days, the student is given a 70% refund of tuition and textbook costs.
3. If returned within 45 days, 50% of tuition and textbook costs will be refunded.
4. After 45 days, no refund is permitted.

Incomplete Grades and Withdrawal Notices

When a student receives the grade of **I**, it means either:

1. The student's work is not of acceptable quality to receive a grade of "C" or higher, and the student is still within the grace period of 30 days to improve or complete the course. There is, however, a \$70 (USD) to grade the course a second time. If the resubmitted coursework is received after 30 days, the final grade will be reduced by one letter grade and for every day there after.
2. The student is still within the course time frame of 12-months after having received the course material.

When a student receives the grade of **W**, it means either:

1. The student's work is not of acceptable quality to receive the grade of "C" or higher. The student had 30 days to improve or complete the course.
2. The student does not return a course within 12 months after receiving it. A withdrawn student forfeits all tuition and academic credit for the course, and a "W" is recorded on the student's transcript.
3. The student formally requested to withdraw from that course.

Guidelines for Written Assignments

The CI Asia Seminary course materials emphasize the importance of personal research in the Scriptures and encourage the clarification of Biblical absolutes. Our content questions generally require short answers that are either correct or incorrect. However, with the more subjective material, a range of answers may be acceptable, and we prefer to use the terms "adequate" and "inadequate," rather than "correct" and "incorrect" when referring to student responses to these questions.

An adequate answer fulfills the following guidelines:

1. The student directly addresses the question. Answers should not be evasive or ambiguous.

2. The student should give equal attention to all parts of the assignment.
3. The student's response should not deviate from the assignment or include unrelated material.
4. Answers should be thoughtful, and include solid scriptural support as much as possible.
5. The student should observe the minimum word requirement for each assignment.

An inadequate answer is one that is deficient in one or more of these areas. (E.g., is illogical, or not based on a consistent interpretation of the Bible, or reflects poor communication skills [grammatically incorrect, multiple typing errors, etc.]) Course work that is poorly written will be given a lower grade even if the answer is correct.

Instructions For Writing Papers

1. Papers should be typed – **not** hand written – in 12-point font (New Times Roman, Century or Arial) and double-spaced using only A4 paper.
2. Papers must follow the APA format (please see below).

3. Papers should also include a title page, citing the student's name, course name and number, date and the title of the assignment.
4. A blank page of paper should then follow the title page.
5. All pages must be numbered.
6. Work presented should be stapled together with a single staple on the top left corner of the page and neatly presented. However, the 25,000 word thesis for the Doctoral Degree needs to be neatly presented in a binder (no less than 6 rings), tabulated with dividers.
7. Sources quoted must always be cited stating the author's last name, year of publication and page number. Endnotes and a bibliography should also be included when sources are used.
8. *Plagiarism.* All sources used for any work submitted must be cited and the author given credit. Any source used without proper citation and which is passed

off as the student's own material is theft plagiarism. Any student caught plagiarizing will immediately receive an "F" for that particular course.

Before Commencing with a Course

When the student chooses a course, it is imperative that he or she designs a plan as to how they are going to achieve the reading and course assignments. This plan can be made by using the course syllabus. They will then need to email or fax their proposed plan to the Dean of the school for his approval. When it has been approved, the student may commence with their course of study. The student is also required to make contact with the Dean of the school a minimum of 4 times during each course. This will help the student have their progress monitored and be able to receive any necessary input. The Dean may be contacted via Skype online chat, MSN Live Messenger, email or by phone. Remember, each course is to be completed within 15 weeks.

Filing for an Extension

If a student is unable to complete the necessary work in the designated time per course, the student may apply for an extension by contacting the CI Asia Seminary's coordinator and dean, Mr. Terry Woodward. An extension of one calendar month will be granted for the student to complete the necessary work. However, there will be a \$70 (USD) extension fee required.

Grading of Assignments

The CI Asia Seminary grading system is as follows:

A	(90 – 100%) =	4.0 Grade points
B	(80 – 89%) =	3.0 Grade points
C	(70 – 79%) =	2.0 Grade points
D	(60 – 69%) =	1.0 Grade points
I/W	(0 – 59%) =	0.0 Grade points

English as a Second Language

Since some of our students use English as a second language, there will be some element of leniency towards them. However, it is still imperative that their work is eligible and well presented. It is therefore advised that they should have someone proof read their work before it is submitted. If there is none available to assist them, one of the staff at CI Asia Seminary will be made available to assist them for a moderate fee. There is one stipulation; the student must correspond directly with the one assisting them (via telephone or internet, i.e. Skype, or MSN Live Messenger).

CI Asia Seminary Library

For certain courses the student will need to rent (for a moderate fee, plus shipping and handling) audio and video materials from the CI Asia Seminary Library.

The following rules apply:

- 1 On no terms may rented materials be duplicated in any way, shape or

- form.
2. Materials rented must be mailed back to the CI Asia Seminary within three weeks from the time of receiving them.
 3. The shipping of rented materials are to be paid by the student.
 4. There is a \$10 (USD) handling fee and a \$10(USD) rental fee per audio or video series used.
 5. Any item not returned in it's proper condition, the student will be expected to replace it at their own expense.
 6. Failure to return rented materials by the due date may result in a financial penalty.

THE MASTER OF MINISTRY DEGREE PROGRAM

Program Description

The Master of Ministry Degree Program is a 36 credit hour program beyond a Bachelors degree. The courses are designed to help students further develop in their respective areas of ministry through correspondence courses, and in some cases through seminars. The maximum transferable graduate credits are 6.

Entrance Requirements

In order to commence with this program, only one of the following three is required:

1. A theological Bachelor degree, or
2. A non-theological Master degree, or
3. A non-theological Bachelor degree (e.g., BA, BS) with one of the following:
 - (i). 30 plus credit hours in Biblical Studies
 - (ii). 5 years confirmed full-time ministerial experience
 - (iii). 12 years confirmed part-time ministerial experience
 - (iv). A written reference of approval from the applicant's pastor

The Master of Ministry (M Min) degree program has been designed to help prepare students to be better equipped in their respective ministry role in the Kingdom of God. In order to receive a Master of Ministry degree, the student must complete the following requirements:

1. Complete 15 credits of required courses.
2. Complete 15 credits of elected courses from the various tracks being offered.
3. Complete 6 credits from a completed project.

THE DOCTOR OF MINISTRY PROGRAM

Program Description

The Doctor of Ministry (D.Min) degree is a program beyond a Master of Ministry degree (or its equivalent). The total number of credits required to pass this degree are 60. This course also has the option of the student completing an approved Doctoral Thesis (25,000 words) worth 9 credits. Upon successful completion of the required coursework with the optional doctoral thesis, the D.Min degree will be conferred upon the student. The Doctor of Ministry program (D.Min) focuses on practical training and equipping, especially in the areas of the prophetic and the apostolic for church ministry.

The curriculum is developed with the following considerations:

1. The degree is ministry-oriented;
2. It can accommodate personal interest
3. Independent research is required for a portion of the degree, with approval of the Academic Board.
